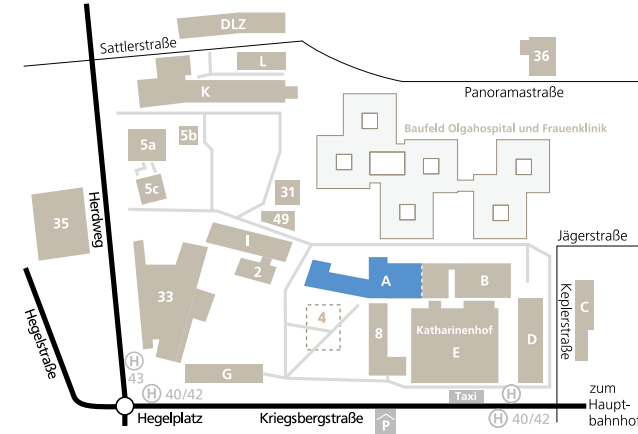

Being the only part of the airway with a closed cartilaginous circumference this area is site of predilection for different lesions like scarring, chronic and acute inflammation as well as Wegener's disease in the larynx or the still poorly understood idiopathic progressive subglottic stenosis. As a consequence this location with its obviously different pathophysiology is highly demanding and challenging. Therefore, successful treatment requires sophisticated and multi-disciplinary concepts in diagnostics as well as therapy.
